

Student Conduct Violations – Administration has the ability to determine consequences above and beyond those outlined below based upon the seriousness of the offense.

<p>USAGE AND/OR POSSESSION OF MIND OR MOOD ALTERING SUBSTANCES OR LOOK-A-LIKES REPRESENTED AS MIND OR MOOD ALTERING SUBSTANCES</p>	<p>Possession (regardless of claimed or denied ownership), receiving, under the influence of or usage of the following items while on school property or at a school event. Alcohol, including “nonalcoholic” beverages being represented as alcoholic beverage e-cigarettes Illegal drugs or narcotics Inhalants Ingestible items Marijuana or paraphernalia* Abuse of Prescribed medications or OTC drugs Vapes, juuls, vape liquids, vape accessories, vape devices, other methods of use or drug or vape paraphernalia*</p>	<p>First time: Immediate 15 day Out of School Suspension, confiscation of everything and contacting of local law enforcement for possible testing and prosecution. Searching of student and items in possession or that they have access to based on reasonable suspicion.</p> <p>Second time: Immediate 30 day suspension up to expulsion for student, confiscation of everything and contacting of local law enforcement for testing and prosecution. Searching of student and items in possession or that they have access to based on reasonable suspicion.</p>
<p>DISTRIBUTION OF MIND OR MOOD ALTERING SUBSTANCES OR LOOK-A-LIKES REPRESENTED AS MIND OR MOOD ALTERING SUBSTANCES</p>	<p>Distribution of the following items, whether just sharing, borrowing, inspecting, carrying, using, selling, bartering, or any type or mode of giving someone else these products while on school property or at a school event. Alcohol, including “nonalcoholic” beverages being represented as alcoholic beverage e-cigarettes Illegal drugs or narcotics Inhalants Ingestible items Marijuana or paraphernalia* Prescribed medications OTC drugs Vapes, juuls, vape liquids, vape accessories, vape devices, or other drug or vape paraphernalia (This may include dropping and leaving the item for someone else to pick up. Use of product is not required by either party.)</p>	<p>Immediate 30 day suspension up to expulsion for student, confiscation of items and contacting of local law enforcement for possible testing and prosecution. Searching of student and items in possession or that they have access to based on reasonable suspicion.</p>

<p>LEGAL CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES:TOBACCO PRODUCTS OR ITEMS REPRESENTED AS TOBACCO</p> <p>SALE OR ATTEMPTED SALE</p>	<p>Sale, attempted sale, or distribution of not limited to: Tobacco products.</p>	<p>Students shall be subject to school consequences, police involvement, suspension, or expulsion as follows: 1st offense Level III: Mandatory ten (10) day out-of-school suspension 2nd offense Level IV: Expulsion</p>
<p>TOBACCO PRODUCTS OR ITEMS REPRESENTED AS TOBACCO</p>	<p>Tobacco-Free Schools Law: The use or possession of tobacco products by any person is in violation of this policy. Violation will result in disciplinary action.</p>	<p>Level III Students who violate the tobacco products policy will be offered the following options: 1st offense: Option 1: Five (5) days out-of-school suspension Option 2: Three (3) days out-of-school suspension plus the student will complete a minimum three (3) hour “stop using” program at parent’s or guardian’s expense. Failure to complete the program in its entirety will result in Option 1 being enforced. 2nd offense: Ten (10) days out-of-school suspension 3rd offense: Expulsion</p>

***Paraphernalia** “means any equipment, product, material, or combination of equipment, products, or materials, which is specifically designed for use in planting; propagating; cultivating; growing; harvesting; manufacturing; compounding; converting; producing; processing; preparing; testing; analyzing; packaging; repackaging; storing; containing; concealing; injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance.” **MCL 333.7451**
